CUMBERLAND COUNTY UTILITIES AUTHORITY December 17, 2015

The Cumberland County Utilities Authority (CCUA) held its Regular Monthly Meeting on Thursday, December 17, 2015 in the Meeting Room of the Operations Building, 333 Water Street, Bridgeton, New Jersey.

Representing the CCUA: Albert Jones, Chairman Keith Wasserman, Vice-Chairman Edward Bethea, Commissioner Angelia Edwards, Commissioner Harvey Friedman, Commissioner Zarko Rajacich, Commissioner Douglas VanSant, Commiossioner Stephen Testa, Auditor Robert O'Donnell, General Counsel Jerome A. Harris, Engineer C. Kenneth Hill, Secretary James Quinn, Treasurer G. Steven Errickson, Director A. Michael Fernandez, Deputy Director Dominic Buirch, Business Administrator Patti McAllister, Assistant Secretary – Treasurer

Chairman Jones called the meeting to order, announced that adequate notice of this meeting has been given in accordance with Chapter 231, P.L. (THE OPEN PUBLIC MEETING ACT) and led in the flag salute.

Secretary Hill called the roll and a quorum was present.

Chairman Jones called for a motion to approve the minutes of the Regular Monthly Meeting of November 23, 2015. Motion was made by Commissioner Bethea, seconded by Vice-Chairman Wasserman and carried unanimously at roll call.

Chairman Jones called for reports.

REPORTS

Director

Director Errickson submitted the November 2015 Discharge Monitoring Report (DMR) for inclusion in the minutes for this meeting. The Authority met all permit discharge conditions during the month and the plant continues to operate very well.

The Director reported meeting with Jerry Harris, Authority Engineer and members of his staff to discuss plant operations and to tour the plant and observe functions throughout the complex. There has been some issues with rags, jump suits and plastic getting into the plant and clogging everything. This is something we will be addressing in the coming year.

Director Errickson also reported meeting with the Cumberland County Solid Waste Committee this month as a committee member. One of the major issues facing Cumberland County is the illegal dumping of trash, appliances and TVs by the road side and NJ State game lands. Everyone should be reminded that TV's and computers can be taken back to the place of purchase without a fee. In NJ it's the law for these items to be recycled by the manufacturer.

He also reported attending two meetings with CCIA to further discuss leasing a Paddle Dryer used for drying sludge. Hopefully this would be a great benefit to the CCUA and the CCIA in saving money and providing landfill cover to the CCIA. We believe we will see much more progress in 2016.

He further noted that the Authority applied 595,000 gallons of sludge at Cumberland Nurseries during the second half of 2015. This resulted in a savings of almost \$ 38,000 had we taken a comparable amount of sludge for incineration at ACUA.

Director Errickson informed the Board that we received our final discharge permit and have been reviewing it. There are significant changes from the draft, that in our opinion, warranted further review. Therefore, we are formally requesting a stay of some of the permit conditions until we can determine whether they are appropriate.

Mr. Errickson reported that the Authority is extending our contract with QC Laboratories for 2 more years in accordance with our bid agreement with them. There are no changes in the contract prices, other than to include two new tests that were not done under our old discharge permit.

The Director noted that we received the DEP report from our lab inspection in June. Several significant problems were noted, primarily having to do with complying with updated quality control requirements. This is under review and a response will be prepared in January.

Director Errickson stated that there has been various meetings and discussions during the month with our engineer, staff and manufacturer representatives to assess the impact of excess solids in our influent and methods of reducing them. This is something that will demand attention in the coming year.

The Director also reported working with Bond Counsel to make sure our financial bases are covered prior to our NJEIT Bond Issue in 2016.

Director Errickson noted that there are a large number of resolutions on the agenda tonight. Hopefully everyone read and understands each resolution and is ready to vote on these matters.

He thanked everyone for their hard work and support given to him this past year and wished everyone a Safe and Happy Holiday. The Director further reminded everyone that retiree, John Healey is again conducting the annual Authority Christmas Bike Drive for the kids in the area and is asking for a donation of any amount you can give.

In conclusion, the Director offered his thanks to Deputy Director Michael Fernandez, Administrative Assistant Patti McAllister, Business Administrator Dominic Buirch and Authority Engineer Jerry Harris for their help with preparing his reports.

Engineer

Mr. Harris reported that design activities continued relative to the design of the 2016 NJEIT Projects, which are the upgrade of the Upper Deerfield (Seabrook) Pumping Station and miscellaneous improvements to the Wastewater Treatment Plant. Work is continuing on developing plans and specifications suitable for bidding and responding to NJDEP comments. A Treatment Works Approval permit application for the Upper Deerfield Pump Station was submitted to the NJDEP. A waiver for a TWA permit for the plant project has been obtained from NJDEP.

Mr. Harris also reported that he reviewed the Final NJDES Discharge permit received from the NJDEP. He is coordinating comments with Deputy Director Fernandez.

Mr. Harris noted that he prepared an amendment to the Engineer's Annual Report for 2015 to clarify the recommended funding levels for the Renewal and Replacement Fund and the Plant Reconstruction Fund.

Mr. Harris lastly reported that a CME Associates team visited the wastewater treatment plant on December 3, 2015 to discuss possible future improvements with emphasis on septage and solids handling. He was also available to provide assistance to the Director and Deputy Director on biogas, sludge management and clarifier coating issues.

Auditor

Mr. Testa reported that he provided staff assistance with respect to Local Public Contract Law questions and worked with management and Bond Counsel with respect to the proposed Series 2016 NJEIT Loans.

Mr. Testa noted that Resolution A on the agenda is to adopt the 2016 Budget. The State has given approval to adopt the 2016 Budget and the Authority held its public hearing on the Budget at the November meeting, and it is appropriate to adopt the Budget at this time.

Resolution B is an annual resolution which directs the trustee to transfer the interest earned in the Renewal & Replacement Fund to the Revenue Fund as required by the Authority's Bond Resolution.

There are other reorganization type resolution such as Resolutions C, D and E that are done each year regarding official banks and depositories and banking business as well as updating the Authority's Cash Management Plan as required. These generally authorize the Authority to do business with certain banks and establish accounts, however this can be amended during the year should the Authority wish to do so.

Lastly and not to be presumptuous, Mr. Testa noted a Resolution on the agenda reappointing his firm for 2016. He stated that "we truly appreciate the Authority's continued confidence in our firm and, as always look forward to serving the Authority."

General Counsel

Mr. O'Donnell reported that Trial date for the clarifier case is now scheduled for January 30, 2016.

Mr. O'Donnell stated he had reviewed one RFQ for the Accountant and two for the Engineer. All three met the requirements for the RFQs. Mr. O'Donnell stated he was available for any questions or concerns by the Director, staff and Commissioners.

Committees

The Employee Relations, Community/Industrial Relations and the Chairman's Special Committee met this past month. Copies of the minutes of the meetings are in the Commissioners packets today.

WHEREAS, the Annual Budget and Capital Budget for the Cumberland County Utilities Authority for the fiscal year period beginning January 1, 2016 and ending December 31, 2016 has been presented and adopted before the Commissioners of the Authority at its open public meeting of December 17, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the Annual Budget and Capital Budget as presented for adoption reflects each item of revenue and appropriation in the same amount and title as set forth in the introduced and approved budget, including all amendments thereto, if any, which have been approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services; and

WHEREAS, the Annual Budget as presented for adoption reflects Total Revenues of \$6,692,000, Total Appropriations, including any Accumulated Deficit, if any, of \$6,772,000 and Total Unrestricted Net Position utilized of \$80,000; and

WHEREAS, the Capital Budget as presented for adoption reflects Total Capital Appropriations of \$2,950,000, Total Unrestricted Net Position planned to be utilized of \$150,000, and Total Renewal & Replacement Reserve Fund planned to be utilized of \$300,000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the Cumberland County Utilities Authority, at an open public meeting held on December 17, 2015, that the Annual Budget and Capital Budget/Program of the Cumberland County Utilities Authority for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2016 and ending December 31, 2016, is hereby adopted and shall constitute an appropriations for the purposes stated; and

RESOLUTION OF THE CUMBERLAND COUNTY UTILITIES AUTHORITY (I) APPROVING A PROJECT REPORT FOR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS OF THE AUTHORITY, AND (II) DIRECTING THAT NOTICE BE GIVEN OF A HEARING FOR THE PROJECT REPORT AND THE INTENT TO ADOPT A SUPPLEMENTAL BOND RESOLUTION OF THE AUTHORITY.

WHEREAS, The Cumberland County Utilities Authority was originally created as The Cumberland County Sewerage Authority pursuant to the county sewerage authorities law, which constituted Chapter 123 of the Pamphlet Laws of 1946 and the acts amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto, codified as N.J.S.A. 40:36A-1 et seq., which was repealed by P.L. 1977, c. 384, Section 16, effective February 10, 1978; and

WHEREAS, The Cumberland County Sewerage Authority was reorganized as The Cumberland County Utilities Authority and continues to exist and to operate pursuant to the municipal and county utilities authorities law, N.J.S.A. 40:14B-1 et seq. (P.L. 1957, Chapter 183, effective August 22, 1957, and the acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto) (the "Act") and pursuant to a resolution of the Board of Commissioners, which was duly filed with the Secretary of State of the State of New Jersey (The Cumberland County Sewerage Authority until its reorganization and The Cumberland County Utilities Authority after its reorganization being herein referred to as the "Authority"); and

WHEREAS, the Act provides that the Authority shall have the power to borrow money and issue its bonds and other obligations and to provide for the rights of the holders of its bonds and other obligations, as provided in the Act, for the purpose of financing the cost of any part of the sewer system (the "System") servicing certain residents of the County of Cumberland (the "County") and for the refunding of outstanding obligations of the Authority; and

WHEREAS, on February 7, 1977, the Authority adopted a general bond resolution entitled, "Resolution Providing for the Issuance of Bonds of The Cumberland County Sewerage Authority and for the Rights of the Holders Thereof, Determining to Construct the Phase I Project of the Authority, Estimating the Cost of the Phase I Project, and Authorizing Initial Bonds to Finance the Portion of Such Estimated Cost Not Paid or Provided for from Governmental Grants for the Phase I Project" (the "General Bond Resolution"); and

WHEREAS, the General Bond Resolution authorizes the Authority to provide for the construction or acquisition of Projects (as defined in the General Bond Resolution) other than the Initial Project (as defined in the General Bond Resolution) and to repay or refund any outstanding bonds and to issue one or more series of Additional Bonds (as defined in the General Bond Resolution) for such purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has determined to issue sewer revenue bonds pursuant to and in accordance with the General Bond Resolution in the principal amount of not to exceed \$2,200,000 for (i) improvements to the Upper Deerfield Pump Station consisting of the conversion from a wet well/dry well configuration to a submersible style station, and including the installation of submersible pumps, electrical and control components, screening devices, mixers, new valve chambers, the replacement of generators, the construction of a

housing structure, and all work necessary and ancillary thereto, (ii) improvements to the Wastewater Treatment Plant consisting of headworks improvements including the replacement of handrails, gratings, sluice gates, grit removal units, and screen improvements, replacement of aeration blowers and clarifier improvements, and all work necessary and ancillary thereto, and (iii) payment of the costs of issuance associated with the issuance of the sewer revenue bonds, all as set forth in the Planning Document dated October 10, 2014 prepared by CME Associates, Consulting and Municipal Engineers and prepared for and submitted to the Authority (the "Project Report") and attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the Authority, in accordance with the provisions of the General Bond Resolution, desires to authorize the issuance and delivery of such sewer revenue bonds in an aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$2,200,000 to be designated "Sewer Revenue Bonds, Series 2016" (the "Series 2016 Bonds") pursuant to a supplemental resolution attached hereto as Exhibit B (the "2016 Supplemental Resolution");

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CUMBERLAND COUNTY UTILITIES AUTHORITY, as follows:

- 1. The Authority hereby approves the Project Report attached as Exhibit A in conjunction Section 725 of the General Bond Resolution.
- 2. The Authority hereby gives notice that it will adopt the 2016 Supplemental Resolution after a hearing at 4:30 p.m. at the January 21, 2016 meeting of the Authority, and directs the Secretary to publish notice of a hearing on the Project Report and the 2016 Supplemental Resolution in the Authorized Newspapers of the Authority (as defined in the General Bond Resolution) at least 15 days prior to such hearing.
- 3. The Authority shall also cause copies of the Project Report and 2016 Supplemental Resolution to be filed with TD Bank, National Association, the Trustee for the Authority and with each Participant, as defined in the General Bond Resolution, prior to such hearing.
- 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
