Mr. Grace noted that we are moving forward in due course with the proposed solar project. A submission of relevant documents will be sent to the DEP before the end of business this week. Any supplemental information that is to be provided to the DEP will be done in short order. A topographical survey was done of the area to ascertain additional information with respect to land use issues relative to the property. In addition, we are gearing up to send the request for qualifications as it relates to the solar project. We expect that the bid documents will be prepared and ready for sending by late November or early December. Updates will be provided as this process continues.

In conclusion, the Director offered his thanks to Deputy Director Michael Fernandez, Administrative Assistant Stephanie Mick, Business Administrator Dominic Buirch, Authority Engineer Jerry Harris and General Counsel James Grace for their help with preparing his report.

#### **Engineer**

Upper Deerfield Pump Station update finds that the agreement and insurance information has been submitted by the contractor, Lance Electric of Tabernacle NJ. One remaining item relative to insurance has been resolved and Notice to Proceed is ready to be issued. Contractor has been submitting shop drawings which are being reviewed by CME. Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvements work to be performed by Centerpoint Associates of Blackwood NJ has also submitted their agreement and insurance information and all paperwork was in order. Notice to Proceed has been issued. The contractor has been submitting shop drawings which are being reviewed by CME. Construction activities are expected to start the week of October 17, 2016. The estimated construction period for each job is approximately one year.

Site visits are scheduled for October 17, 2016 for use in preparing the 2016 Annual Report.

There was no activity on the Plant Discharge Permit. We are waiting for NJDEP response to request for Adjudicatory Hearing / Permit Stay.

Mr. Harris lastly reported that he was available to provide assistance to the Director and Deputy Director on engineering matters, and coordinated with Bond Counsel on NJEIT loan.

#### **Auditor**

Mr. Testa reported that he worked with management and met with the Finance and Budget Committee with regards to the proposed 2017 Budget.

Mr. Testa also noted that there is a resolution on our agenda to introduce the 2017 Budget. Once introduced, the Budget will be submitted to the State of New Jersey Division of Local Government Services for their review. The State has 45 days to perform their review. As required by the Authority's Bond Resolution, the Authority will hold its public hearing on the proposed Budget at the November meeting. Once the Authority receives State approval, it can adopt the Budget at the December meeting as required.

#### **General Counsel**

Mr. Grace reported at this time he had no new information to report with respect to Biosolids. He will continue to explore options that will place our Authority in a position where we can save money and continue to help the environment as well as farmers in the surrounding area.

Mr. Grace also stated that the hearing in the matter of CCUA V. Michael Fuentes was held on Wednesday October 19, 2016 at which point we were able to obtain a default. We will proceed to enter default judgment and undertake collection efforts in hopes of obtaining the \$1,776 necessary to repair the fence damaged in the accident, which occurred on or about February 15, 2016.

Mr. Grace also reported in the matter of CCUA V. Jennifer Handoz and Michael Martin, the hearing on this matter is scheduled for October 25, 2016. At this time, he is optimistic that we will prevail in this claim, there is just the matter of undertaking the task of collecting the funds.

Director Errickson noted that he along with Deputy Directors Mike Fernandez and Dan Jefferson and Henry from CME took a tour of another Sewer Authority in North Wales Pennsylvania. The purpose of the tour was to see in person one of the new "Multi Rake Bar Screens" and "Grit Separating and Washing Systems" in action. Everyone was impressed with the efficiency of the operation and low maintenance to the machinery.

Director Errickson also reported that safety training in CPR and Confined Space has been completed for all plant personnel this past month. One staff member who has been out on medical leave has returned to work on October 14, 2016.

The Director reported that we have settled into a sludge disposal schedule of three (3) bins of sludge cake per week to ACUA and two (2) tanks of liquid sludge to DELCORA. This seems to keep up with our daily production needs. After updating our sludge cost analysis, DELCORA and ACUA, as well as Ash Lane Farm where we occasionally take sludge as a customer for land application, all are within \$ 50 a dry ton of each other for total cost of disposal. We need to keep a base amount of liquid sludge going to DELCORA in order to keep an active account with them for emergency disposal, as they are the only incinerator that will accept liquid sludge.

The Director reported that he met with our Engineer for a facility review as part of our annual report. Due to emerging issues with our grit and solids removal system at the head works, it is expected that our Capital Plan will have some revisions. On a positive note, we had an integrity check of the sludge storage tank performed by TTI, an experienced tank testing firm, and it passed with no issues noted.

Director Errickson also reported that Centerpoint has started work on the plant improvement contract, and we have had significant issues develop around their compliance with safety standards. Lance Electric was given a notice to proceed with the Upper Deerfield contract and has submitted a construction schedule for review.

The Director also informed the Authority Board that Cumberland Dairy, after paying a penalty assessment of over \$ 60,000, again has significant violations during September and October. We are at the point where we will need to issue a consent order for them to make significant upgrades to their pretreatment system, as all their promised process and quality control plans to reduce flow and capture product waste appears to have had no substantial impact.

We have made public notice and provided our industries with a guidance document on permit modifications for emergency management plans. We expect to meet individually with the industries in November to review this.

Director Errickson also reported that in addition to any standard SURR (Sewer Use Rules and Regulations) changes that are required by our budgetary process, which requires a public hearing, we will be proposing changes this year to require septage haulers to pay in a more timely fashion. We will propose if service is suspended for late payment that the entire 30 and 60 day balances must be paid in full before disposal approval is restored.

The Director also noted that there was a meeting of the Finance and Budget Committee this past month and Committee Chairman Wasserman will be reporting on this later in the meeting.

Two main areas for upgrades would be grit and solids management at septage and head works.
