The Cumberland County Utilities Authority (CCUA) held its Regular Monthly Meeting on Thursday, April 20, 2023, in the Meeting Room of the Operations Building, 333 Water Street, Bridgeton, New Jersey.

Chairman Jones called the meeting to order, announced that adequate notice of this meeting has been given in accordance with Chapter 231, P.L. (THE OPEN PUBLIC MEETING ACT) and led the flag salute.

Secretary Maier called the roll. A quorum was present.

Motion to Open the Floor for Public Comments on Items on the Agenda offered by Commissioner Whelan, seconded by Commissioner Smith-Bey and approved.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Nancy Ridgway from Upper Deerfield commented on Resolution #3325, she said she wholeheartedly agreed with this resolution, she just doesn't understand why it took so long.

Motion to Close Public Comment portion on agenda items offered by Commissioner Daddario, seconded by Commissioner Whelan and approved.

Chairman Jones called for a motion to approve the minutes of the Regular Monthly Meeting of March 16, 2023. The motion was offered by Commissioner Rajacich and seconded by Commissioner Whelan and approved.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT

Authority Board Meeting Thursday April 20th, 2023
Report of Executive Director

Mr. Chairman, Commissioners, Staff, and members of the Public: I would like to begin by submitting the Discharge Monitoring Report (DMR) for February 2023 for inclusion into the minutes of this report.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone for taking the time to attend today's Board meeting. Additionally, I would congratulate Chairman Al Jones on being recognized with the Men of Distinction Great Fathers Award, and former Chairperson Nancy Sungenis on being recognized with the Cumberland County Legends Award.

Activities for the Month:

Budget & Finance

- o The Authority's 2021 Audit has been submitted to the DCA for review.
- The Authority continues to supply requested information to the Auditor for the 2022 Audit.

Executive Director's report continued:

- **Sludge Disposal** The Authority is currently hauling two (2) loads per day to Delcora with C&H providing assistance as needed. The sludge storage tank is at an acceptable level at this time. The Authority has also disposed of sludge cake to ACUA from the Authority's first pilot test.
- **Plant Discharge** The plant is operating well, and we are meeting our effluent discharge limits, in some cases we are meeting those limits in the single digits.

Operations and Maintenance –

- The headworks upgrade project has continued this month with the south grit system being temporarily placed in service with minor alterations needed.
- Operations staff has placed the secondary clarifier polymer system in service to help with temperature related settling problems.
- Operations staff has placed the north primary clarifier in service with both primaries online at this time.
- The Authority has conducted sampling this month for both the bioassay and priority pollutants analysis and the results are pending.
- The Authority in conjunction with Suburban Engineering has begun an evaluation project to determine what equipment upgrades would be necessary to produce a sludge cake that would be acceptable for disposal via composting (Synagro) and/or incineration (ACUA). Dewatering centrifuge and rotary press technologies are currently under review. The study will be evaluating different feed blends to determine the optimal mixture to maximum cake solids with the lowest O & M costs.
- The Logan Township Wastewater Treatment Plant has permanently discontinued accepting septage loads this month, the CCUA is experiencing a significant increase in septage volumes as a result. Plant operations is being closely monitored for any adverse effects at this time.

Executive Director's Reported continued:

Collection System

The Authority continues to work with the County and Mount Construction on the bypass / relocation plan of the Upper Deerfield force main, for the Mayor Aitken Bridge project. The contractor has placed the Upper Deerfield force main on by-pass. The Authority routinely monitors the operation with no problems being reported.

Miscellaneous

- The Authority switched to CASA Payroll on April 1st, 2023, with no issues being reported.
- A pair of Ospreys decided to make a nest on top of the plant's main electrical service pole. The appropriate agencies were contacted to relocate the nest to protect both the Ospreys and ensure that the plant didn't experience an electrical outage. Atlantic City Electric installed a 50' pole with a platform near the service pole and relocated the nest to the newly installed platform.
- The Authority has been in contact with CCTEC to discuss apprenticeship / internship opportunities with the Authority.

Commissioner Rajacich asked a question about the repairs on Mayor Aitken Drive. No work has been done on the site for over two months. Director Carlson advised that it has nothing to do with the CCUA it is a county project.

SUBURBAN CONSULTING ENGINEERS, INC. (SCE) is pleased to provide the following status report for the month of April 2023 for the Cumberland County Utilities Authority (CCUA).

Engineer's Report Continued:

I. TREATMENT PLANT PROJECTS

A. TREATMENT PLANT IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

Project Scope Overview:

The project scope will include the rehabilitation of concrete surfaces throughout the treatment facility including headworks, clarifiers, aeration and chlorine contact tank. Electrical upgrades at the head works and addressing process piping leaks at the aeration tanks. The project will utilize Clean Water State Revolving Funds (CWSRF).

Services Provided:

SCE and the CCUA created the project in H2Loans to start the process through the Infrastructure Bank (I-Bank) for CWSRF and a proposal for professional services based on the latest defined scope has been prepared and finalized which includes the preparation of Environmental Planning Document, site inspection for mechanical, electrical and structural components, specifications, plans and construction cost estimate. Proposal has been submitted and SCE is awaiting authorization to proceed. Anticipate construction to commence in the fall of 2023.

B DEWATERING SLUDGE PROCESSING IMPROVEMENTS

Project Scope Overview:

Project includes assisting the Authority in the review and optimization of sludge processing at the plant. Currently the Authority has two (2) proposals for the completion of pilot testing to determine the optimal treatment process. Final project will review the options of treatment and disposal of biosolids.

Services Provided:

SCE and the CCUA created the project in H2Loans to start the process through the I-Bank for CWSRF. SCE met with the CCUA on Thursday, March 9 to complete necessary preinspection work and to complete a

detailed work plan for the execution of the two (2) pilot technologies. Preparation and planning for the mobilization of the Alfa Laval Centrifuge and the Fournier Rotary Press were completed through the month of March. Mobilization of two (2) 21,000-gallon frac tanks, hosing and the completion of piping modifications were necessary to provide the proper feed and blend of sludge to the pilots.

On Tuesday, April 11 the Afla Laval Centrifuge pilot trailer arrived onsite and was setup. The first week of the operations confirmed polymer feed rates and included two days of testing on digested sludge. The week of April 17 will see two more tests completed before demobilization is completed on Friday, April 21.

On Monday, April 24 the Fournier Rotary Press pilot trailer will arrive and testing on an additional five (5) sludge blends will be completed. The results will be utilized in the continued planning for the improvements in the dewatering building and for the optimization of the overall sludge operation.

C. LABORATORY IMPROVEMENTS

Project Scope Overview:

Project includes the replacement of the existing laboratory fume hood with a new working model. A quote has been previously received to complete the replacement work.

Services Provided:

SCE will assist CCUA in the completion of this necessary replacement work. SCE received the Limited Asbestos Sampling Report completed for the fume hood, dated October 18, 2022. SCE will request competitive quotes for the remediation of the asbestos material which will allow for the proposed fume hood replacement to be completed.

D. WASH DOWN WATER IMPROVEMENTS

Project Scope Overview:

Engineer's Report continued:

Project scope is currently in development. The CCUA has an issue with both the flowrate and pressure provided by the wash down water supply pumps. SCE while working with the Authority will review the existing conditions of the supply hydraulics, pump design and discharge head conditions to determine potential improvements.

Services Provided:

Full scope of services to be determined.

II. COLLECTION SYSTEM PROJECTS

A. GLASS STREET PUMP STATION IMPROVEMENTS

Project Scope Overview:

The project scope includes addressing the influent channel and grinder/comminutor capacity, general facility improvements and the installation of an additional force main through horizontal directional drill from the pump station to Water Street to provide sufficient capacity and redundancy. The intention will be to utilize State Fiscal Year 2024, Clean Water State Revolving Funds.

Services Provided:

SCE and the CCUA created the project in H2Loans to start the process through the I-Bank for CWSRF. SCE will continue to review available engineering documents provided by the CCUA and previous professionals to develop a detailed scope of needs and the associated professional services required. It is anticipated that the project will include CWSRF funding, preparation of Environmental Planning Documents, site survey, bathometric survey, geotechnical evaluation, permitting, specifications, plans and cost estimates. SCE is finalizing the scope for the proposed design services and anticipates having this proposal prepared by the end of the month.

A RESOLUTION AWARDING CONTRACT TO SUBURBAN CONSULTING ENGINEERS, INC. FOR PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING SERVICES IN CONNECTION WITH THE TREATMENT PLANT REHABILITATION PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Cumberland County Utilities Authority (CCUA or Authority) utilizing the "fair and open" process that is described in N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.5 et. Seq. publicized a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for Consulting Engineers and on November 15, 2022, the Authority's Executive Director received the qualifications for the 2023 CCUA's Consulting Engineer Contract; and

WHEREAS, after reviewing the qualifications that were received, the Authority decided to award its 2023 Consulting Engineer's Contract to Suburban Consulting Engineers, Inc. as more fully set forth in Resolution #3296, adopted on December 15, 2022, the substance of which is repeated and incorporated herein by this reference thereto as if more fully set forth; and

WHEREAS, the CCUA has a need for professional engineering and contract phase services in connection with the Treatment Plant Rehabilitation Project; and

WHEREAS, Suburban Consulting Engineers, Inc. has submitted a proposal, dated March 15th, 2023 (annexed as Exhibit "A") indicating that it would perform the required services for \$108,350.00;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the Cumberland County Utilities Authority as follows:

- 1. All of the statements of the preamble are repeated and are incorporated herein by this reference thereto as though the same were set forth at length.
- A Contract for professional engineering and construction phase services in connection with the Treatment Plant Rehabilitation Project is awarded to Suburban Consulting Engineers, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$108,3500.00, including previous and future billing without further authorization of the Authority.
- 3. The Authority Executive Director is authorized to execute a professional engineering contract that incorporates the aforementioned March 15th, 2023 proposal from Suburban Consulting Engineers, Inc., along with such other terms and conditions as shall be deemed necessary and appropriate by the Authority Solicitor.
