The Cumberland County Utilities Authority (CCUA) held its Regular Monthly Meeting on Thursday, June 15, 2023, in the Meeting Room of the Operations Building, 333 Water Street, Bridgeton, New Jersey.

Chairman Jones called the meeting to order, announced that adequate notice of this meeting has been given in accordance with Chapter 231, P.L. (THE OPEN PUBLIC MEETING ACT) and led the flag salute.

Secretary Maier called the roll. A quorum was present.

Motion to Open the Floor for Public Comments for Items on the Agenda offered by Commissioner Piccioni, seconded by Commissioner Smith Bey and approved.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

No public comments.

Chairman Jones called for a motion to approve the minutes of the Regular Monthly Meeting of May 18, 2023. The motion was offered by Commissioner Daddario and seconded by Commissioner Smith Bey and approved.

REPORTS

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT

Authority Board Meeting Thursday June 15, 2023
Report of Executive Director

Mr. Chairman, Commissioners, Staff and members of the Public: I would like to begin by submitting the Discharge Monitoring Report (DMR) for April 2023 for inclusion into the minutes of this report.

Activities for the Month:

Budget & Finance

- The Authority continues to supply requested information to the Auditor for the 2022 Audit.
- **Sludge Disposal** The Authority is currently hauling two (2) loads per day to Delcora with C&H providing assistance as needed, the sludge storage tank is at an acceptable level at this time.
- **Plant Discharge** The plant is operating well, and we are meeting our effluent discharge limits, in some cases we are meeting those limits in the single digits.
- Operations and Maintenance -

Executive Director's report continued:

- The headworks upgrade project, the Authority continues with the grit removal manufacturer to discover the cause and solution of the plugging issues with the head cell.
- The Authority and Suburban Engineering held a plant rehabilitation project kick off meeting on May 18th, 2023. Operations staff has taken the requested equipment/tankage offline for a structural site inspection which was held on June 9th. The operations staff will now place the out-of-service equipment back in-service and take the other train out-of-service for inspection. Suburban Engineering inspection included two influent equalization tanks, south grit chamber, south primary clarifier, north aeration tank, north secondary clarifier and south chlorine contact tanks.
- Maintenance staff cleaned the west equalization tank and replaced the aerators.
- The SCADA system upgrade project has continued this month with the Authority meeting with Avaceon to review the PID drawings, minor revisions were noted.

Collection System

The Authority continues to work with the County and Mount Construction on the bypass/relocation plan of the Upper Deerfield force main, for the Mayor Aitken Bridge project. The Authority met with the County and Mount Construction to discuss some installation issues which have been rectified.

Miscellaneous

 I would like to congratulate Ralph Gardner on successfully passing both his NJDEPS-3 and C-3 tests.

Executor Director's report continued:

- The Authority has been in Contact with the Cumberland County Development Corp. (CDC), about a possible sewer service extension project in Hopewell Township as this project moves forward.
- The Authority has also been in communication with the County about possible further sewer services. The Authority has an authorized Sewer Service Area as defined by the County Commissioners. Additionally, there is an approved Sewer Service Master Plan for Cumberland County, any modifications to this Master Plan would require NJDEP approval.

Director Carlson advised that the 2023 Cumberland County Insurance Commission Wellness Incentive Program Grant in the amount of \$1,000 has been approved. Fresh Fruit Fridays and smoothies will be made available to the CCUA staff to help promote healthy eating habits.

Questions were raised about expanding sewer services at the CCUA. The Director showed a map of the CCUA service areas currently approved for by the DEP. Within these areas there are still homeowners who have not connected to sewer services.

Director Carlson advised that in order to expand the CCUA service area it will require DEP approval which could take between three to five years.

Suburban Engineering Client Development Manager, Eleni Giannikopoulosi, explained that there are certain criteria that if met would permit the CCUA to apply for funding assistance programs to expand services.

SUBURBAN CONSULTING ENGINEERS, INC. (SCE) is pleased to provide the following status report for the month of June 2023 for the Cumberland County Utilities Authority (CCUA).

I. TREATMENT PLANT PROJECTS

A. TREATMENT PLANT IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

Project Scope Overview:

The project scope will include the rehabilitation of concrete surfaces throughout the treatment facility including headworks, clarifiers, aeration and chlorine contact tank. Electrical upgrades at the headworks and addressing process piping leaks at the aeration tanks. The project will utilize Clean Water State Revolving Funds (CWSRF).

Services Provided:

A project kickoff meeting with CCUA was held May 18, 2023. SCE conducted a preliminary site investigation after the kickoff meeting with CCUA. Research has begun on concrete surface rehabilitation methods and vendors for materials. Draft quantity takeoffs of concrete surface rehabilitation area and replacement of metal railings have been prepared based on our preliminary site investigation. A structural and electrical site investigation was conducted on June 9, 2023. An Existing Conditions and Preliminary Proposed Scope of Work Report will be provided by the June 15, 2023, CCUA Meeting. Once the report is reviewed by CCUA, SCE will organize a meeting to discuss the best course of action for finalizing the project scope and completing the design of this project. Anticipated construction commencement is fall of 2023.

B. DEWATERING SLUDGE PROCESSING IMPROVEMENTS

Project Scope Overview:

Project includes assisting the Authority in the review and optimization of sludge processing at the plant. Currently the Authority has two (2) proposals for the completion of pilot testing to determine the optimal treatment process. Final project will review the options of treatment and disposal of biosolids.

Services Provided:

Executive Director Carlson indicated on May 15, 2023, that no test results have been provided at this time and he will follow up to confirm anticipated completion time. The results will be utilized in the continued planning for the improvements in the dewatering building and for the optimization of the overall sludge operation. CCUA to compile available data/plans on existing system, process flows, etc. and provide to SCE at the June 15, 2023, CCUA Meeting. Once optimal dosing testing and pilot work on rotary press and centrifuge has been completed, SCE will review available data and prepare recommendations anticipated by August 2023.

C. LABORATORY IMPROVEMENTS

Project Scope Overview:

Project includes the replacement of the existing laboratory fume hood with a new working model. A quote has been previously received to complete the replacement work.

Services Provided:

SCE will assist CCUA in the completion of this necessary replacement work. SCE received the Limited Asbestos Sampling Report completed for the fume hood, dated October 18, 2022. SCE conferred with in house team members that are available and knowledgeable in this type of work. SCE to discuss with CCUA scope of work and will continue to solicit competitive quotes for the remediation of the asbestos material which will allow for the proposed fume hood replacement to be completed.

D. WASH DOWN WATER IMPROVEMENTS

Project Scope Overview:

Project scope is currently in development. The CCUA has an issue with both the flowrate and pressure provided by the wash down water supply pumps. SCE while working with the Authority will review the existing conditions of the supply hydraulics, pump design and discharge head conditions to determine potential improvements. Services Provided: Full scope of services to be determined. Executive Director Carlson had indicated on May 15, 2023, that

CCUA will evaluate the entire system to determine potential needs for improvement and look for plans to provide to SCE for our use and reference.

II COLLECTION SYSTEM PROJECTS

A. GLASS STREET PUMP STATION IMPROVEMENTS

Project Scope Overview:

The project scope includes addressing the influent channel and grinder/comminutor capacity, general facility improvements and the installation of an additional force main through horizontal directional drill from the pump station to Water Street to provide sufficient capacity and redundancy. The intention will be to utilize State Fiscal Year 2024, Clean Water State Revolving Funds.

Services Provided:

SCE and the CCUA created the project in H2Loans to start the process through the I-Bank for CWSRF. It is anticipated that the project will include CWSRF funding, preparation of Environmental Planning Documents, site survey, bathometric survey, geotechnical evaluation, permitting, specifications, plans and cost estimates. A preliminary site walkthrough was conducted on May 5, 2023, to discuss an overview of the project. SCE will continue to review available engineering documents provided by the CCUA and previous professionals to develop a detailed scope of needs and the associated professional services required. SCE anticipates finalizing our proposal by the July 2023 Authority Meeting.

III. MISCELANEOUS IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

SCE will continue to review and evaluate all miscellaneous items noted by CCUA and develop a list of future projects for preliminary investigations to be conducted and proposals to be developed. These projects at this time include but are not limited to;

A. Ultrasonic Thickness Measurements – TTI Inspections performed an Ultrasonic Thickness testing on October 6, 2016, on the Sludge Storage Tank. The 1st Shell Course was noted to have a remaining service life of 14 years ending in approximately 2030. A follow up inspection was recommended by approximately 2021. A proposal by TTI Inspections dated April 13, 2023, was reviewed by SCE coatings experts and we recommend that CCUA proceed with those inspections noted in the proposal to establish a new baseline of conditions for future tank maintenance planning.

RESOLUTION OF THE CUMBERLAND COUNTY UTILITIES AUTHORITY SUPPORTING THE WATER SYSTEMS PFAS LIABILITY PROTECTION ACT

RESOLUTION OF Cumberland County Utilities Authority TO CALL UPONNew Jersey U.S. Senators, the Hon. Cory A. Booker and the Hon. Robert Menendez to join Sen. Cynthia Lummis in sponsoring the "Water Systems PFAS Liability Protection Act."

Whereas, The Mission of Cumberland County Utilities Authority is to serve the people that live, work and visit our community, efficient waste water disposal services through the use of sound management principles, modern scientific practices and effective planning to maintain our infrastructure and safeguard public health while imposing minimal impact on the environment; and

Whereas, PFAS substances are a threat to human health and the environment; and

Whereas, Cumberland County Utilities Authority is ready and willing to do its part to remove PFAS substances from systems to protect public health and the environment; and

Whereas, Cumberland County Utilities Authority is responsible to protect the interests of its ratepayers; and

Whereas, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) proposes to designate certain per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) as hazardous substances under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA; a.k.a., Superfund Act); and

Whereas, under a broad definition of CERCLA, public and private drinking water utilities, wastewater agencies (POTW), stormwater utilities, and biosolids management programs are potentially subject to CERCLA with regard to PFAS; and

Whereas, public and private drinking water utilities, wastewater agencies (POTW), stormwater utilities, and biosolids management programs are not polluters. They are passive receivers of PFAS substances and do not manufacture, use, or originate the PFAS substances; and

Whereas, CERCLA was enacted to hold polluters responsible for environmental cleanups; and

Whereas, being subject to such a CERCLA designation would ensnare public and private drinking water utilities, wastewater agencies (POTW), stormwater

utilities, and biosolids management programs in endless litigation at the expense of taxpayers and ratepayers; and

Whereas, in the past, some New Jersey utilities have been drawn into Superfund actions even though they are not polluters; and

Whereas, EPA assurances that it will rely on its enforcement discretion to keep POTWs from being forced to pay for cleanup under CERCLA fall short because 1) discretion can vary based on the administration and 2) polluters may employ legal strategies that draw public and private drinking water utilities, wastewater agencies (POTW), stormwater utilities, and biosolids management programs into litigation; and

Whereas, taxpayers and ratepayers are "innocent bystanders" and should not be made to pay to further polluter legal strategies, nor should they be subject to the regulatory uncertainty associated with EPA "discretion"; and

Whereas, cost implications the proposed CERCLA designation are complicated by the fact that PFAS substances aren't introduced into the environment in a single or several discreet "spills' but are continually being introduced into the environment;

Now Therefore Be It Resolved that Cumberland County Utilities Authority calls on the Hon. Cory A. Booker and the Hon. Robert Menendez to join Sen. Cynthia Lummis in sponsoring the "Water Systems PFAS Liability Protection Act" because it would explicitly exempt public and private drinking water utilities, wastewater agencies (POTW), stormwater utilities, and biosolids management programs from CERCLA liability.
