RESOLUTION TO EXTEND THE CONTRACT WITH C & H DISPOSAL SERVICE FOR PROVIDING SLUDGE AND SOLID WASTE HAULING SERVICES

WHEREAS, the Cumberland County Utilities Authority entered into a contract on May 31, 2012 with C & H Disposal Service for Providing Sludge and Solid Waste Hauling Services, in the amount of \$195.00 per Solid/per bin and \$.0473 per gallon terminating May 31, 2014; and

WHEREAS, the Specifications for this contract provide that it may be extended for an additional period, up to 24 months; and

WHEREAS, C & H Disposal Service has indicated, by written notice, their desire to extend the terms and conditions of their proposal for an additional 12 month period, June 1, 2014 to May 31, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has been satisfied with the services rendered by C & H Disposal Service, 47 Griers Lane, Elmer, New Jersey, 08318 for providing Sludge and Solid Waste Hauling Services; and

WHEREAS, the Authority desires to extend the contract with C & H Disposal Service for an additional 12 month period.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the Cumberland County Utilities Authority as follows:

- That the Authority extend the contract entered into with C & H Disposal Service, 47 Griers Lane, Elmer, New Jersey, 08318 for an additional 12 months, terminating May 31, 2015, for the same terms and conditions of the existing contract for Sludge and Solid Waste Hauling Services in the amount of \$195.00 per bid for Solid Waste and \$.0473 per gallon for Sludge.

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REGULAR MEETING CUMBERLAND COUNTY UTILITIES AUTHORITY March 20, 2014

The Cumberland County Utilities Authority (CCUA) held its Regular Monthly Meeting on Thursday, March 20, 2014 in the Meeting Room of the Operations Building, 333 Water Street, Bridgeton, New Jersey.

Representing the CCUA: Albert Jones, Chairman Sam Boutros, Commissioner Angelia Edwards, Commissioner Harvey Friedman, Commissioner Donald Olbrich, Commissioner Steve Testa, Auditor Jerome A. Harris, Engineer Robert O'Donnell, General Counsel James Quinn, Treasurer C. Kenneth Hill, Secretary G. Steven Errickson, Director A. Michael Fernandez, Deputy Director Sandy Acevedo, Business Administrator Patti McAllister, Assistant Secretary – Treasurer

Chairman Jones called the meeting to order, announced that adequate notice of this meeting has been given in accordance with Chapter 231, P.L. (THE OPEN PUBLIC MEETING ACT) and led in the flag salute.

Secretary Hill called the roll and a quorum was present. Vice Chairman Wasserman and Commissioner Bethea were recorded as excused absences.

Chairman Jones called for a motion to approve the minutes of the Regular Monthly Meeting of February 20, 2014. Motion was made by Commissioner Friedman, seconded by Commissioner Olbrich and was carried unanimously at roll call, with Commissioner Olbrich recorded as abstained.

Chairman Jones called for reports.

REPORTS

Director

Director Errickson submitted the February 2014 Discharge Monitoring Report (DMR) for inclusion in the minutes of this meeting.

The Director reported meeting with Ted Cowgill from Avicon Inc. to examine our handling system of sludge and explore possible cost saving methods.

The Director noted that Solar City Inc. gave a presentation to him and the staff that promoted ideas and thoughts on installation of solar energy. The CCUA has been looking into solar power development by way of financing, engineering and installation, along with the ability to monitor the system, for a few years.

The Director also reported meeting with Susquehanna Bank representatives to discuss renewal of services with them. Susquehanna handles the Authority's local accounts. It is important to note, that because of new laws passed by Congress for the banking industry, there may be number of increased or additional fees this year.

He informed the board that KDI Inc. held one of several training sessions for the new printer/scanner for the staff. The printer/scanner and Smart Search software is fully up and running and the accounts payable department has adopted the system with ease. It's expected that the system's use will continue to grow within the plant to further save time and effort.

Director Errickson and Deputy Director Fernandez met with Authority Engineers (CME) Jerry Harris and Michael McClelland to discuss the Authority's five and ten year plans. Detailed discussion focused on repair and replacement in the plant and capital projects for future needs.

Director Errickson also noted that he recently attended the Association of Environmental Authorities Convention in Atlantic City with some of the Commissioners.

The first training session of this year was held this month, by PTP Consulting Services, Joe DeMarco on MSDS and safety training for all plant personnel.

Director Errickson further reported on Authority operations during the past month, stating that land application of sludge should start by April 1, which is late. The late start comes at a time when the GCUA incinerators have been down for maintenance. Fortunately, we have been able to take some sludge to Ash Lane and are filling the secondary digester, which takes pressure off immediate sludge disposal needs. GCUA should be back in operation by the end of the week.

The construction work has been completed, except for the final site cleanup. The secondary digester is now being filled and we should be able to test its operation next week. The primary digester is fully operational and producing enough gas to run the boiler and still have excess. While there are still a few minor bugs to work out, it appears that we are producing more gas than previously, which had been one of the goals of the construction project.

After the cause of discharge violations in January, was identified and corrected, we have had no problems meeting our permit conditions for the month of February. The DEP verbally granted an affirmative defense for the January violations, but we have not received written confirmation. Our proposed effluent discharge permit fee for 2014 has been set by DEP at just under \$ 38,000. This will be the third year in a row that we've seen a decrease. A permit fee decrease is normally the result of improved effluent discharge quality, and we had not been expecting to see a decrease this year.

The Director stated that all of our industrial dischargers were in compliance with their permits this month. We are continuing to review permit modifications with them to address ammonia concerns. Also the permit applications have been sent to the ethanol facility in the Bridgeton Industrial Park, and CCIA has requested a permit for use under emergency situations.

The Director briefly reviewed the resolutions on the agenda, stating that Resolution "A" is to approve Change Order # 2, in the amount of \$ 54,767.75 for unforeseen pipe work inside the Digester Tank. This work had to be performed now, or would have cost hundreds of thousands of dollars later to repair. The Director further noted that even with the Change Orders, the project came in under budget, by \$ 62,618. Resolution "B" approves specifications and advertises for bid the Miscellaneous Construction Service to handle emergency repairs that are too large, or we do not have the equipment to do ourselves, on an as needed basis. Resolution "C" is to approve a Tort Claim Form that has been requested for use by the County Insurance Fund Commission and recommended by our Risk Consultant. Resolution "D" extends the Sludge and Waste hauling service contract to the current hauler for one year at the same rate received now. Resolution "E" this is to set aside funds and authorize the Director to conduct a study on site investigation, environmental constraints and necessary permitting for the placement of solar panels at the CCUA. This will be done after calculation of the acceptable amount of KW allowed by Atlantic City Electric and the total cost is "not to exceed" four thousand dollars. In conclusion, the Director thanked the Deputy Director, Michael Fernandez, Business Administrator Sandy Acevedo and Administrative Assistant, Patti McAllister for their help with his reports this month.

Engineer

Mr. Harris reported that he met with the Director, Deputy Director and Business Administrator to discuss project funding opportunities and long term financing. They also reviewed solar opportunities.

Auditor

Mr. Testa reported that while there are a few procedures to complete with respect to the 2013 Audit, they are working on completing the draft portion of the 2013 Audit Report. He provided management with certain draft information to enable the Authority to prepare its section, namely, Management's Discussion and Analysis. He will also review the draft with management. Once the entire report is complete, the draft will be provided to the Finance and Budget Committee for their review. Then a Committee meeting should be held to review the draft report, and, once approved, a copy of the draft will be sent to all of the Commissioners for their approval. Receipt of the final report should be acknowledged and certified by the Commissioners at the April meeting.

General Counsel

Mr. O'Donnell stated that the estimate for the clarifier work came in at \$85,850. The cost for the engineer and other labor charges were approximately \$2,500. Therefore, the Authority will be seeking \$88,350 in damages, plus the costs of the suit.

Mr. O'Donnell further reported that he had a couple of meetings and phone calls with the Director over some issues regarding connections and the Sewer Use Rules and Regulations.

Mr. O'Donnell stated he was available for any questions or concerns by staff and commissioners.

Committees

The Facilities Expansion/Construction Committee met on March 20, 2014. The purpose of the meeting was to review Change Order # 2 which is on the agenda today. Chairman Errickson explained the need for the change order, as well as the cost savings netted.
