The Cumberland County Utilities Authority (CCUA) held its Regular Monthly Meeting on Thursday May 20, 2021, in the Meeting Room of the Operations Building 333 Water Street, Bridgeton, New Jersey. The meeting was also attended by several persons via Zoom.

Representing the CCUA: Albert Jones, Chairperson Rick Dawson, Vice Chairperson William Andre, Commissioner Angelia Edwards, Commissioner Zarko Rajacich, Commissioner Kenny Smith-Bey, Commissioner Todd Edwards, Commissioner John Fuqua, Secretary G. Steven Errickson, Executive Director Donald Olbrich, Treasurer Gregg L. Zeff, General Counsel Steve Testa, Auditor Glenn Miller, Engineer Stephanie Mick, Assistant Secretary/Treasurer Bob Carlson, Resident Engineer Dominic Buirch, Business Administrator Daniel Jefferson, Executive Deputy Director

Chairperson Jones called the meeting to order, announced that the adequate notice of this meeting has been given in accordance with Chapter 231,P.L (THE OPEN PUBLIC MEETING ACT) the flag salute was performed.

Secretary Fuqua called the roll, and quorum was present.

Chairperson Jones called for a motion to approve the minutes of the Regular Monthly Meeting of April 15, 2021. Motion was made by Commissioner Edwards and seconded by Commissioner Andre and carried unanimously at roll call.

Chairperson Jones called for Directors' report.

REPORTS

Director

Director Errickson submitted Discharge Monitoring Report (DMR) for April 2021 inclusions into the minutes of this meeting. The activities for the month.

Activities

Upper Deerfield – Nitrate levels in the water continue to be an issue in Upper Deerfield and has been very tough to resolve. Upper Deerfield has contacted DEP who is not getting more involved with this problem and will join in with our discussions and problem-solving efforts.

Labor Negotiation – Opening session with the CWA and CCUA was held May 12, 2021. Some progress was achieved, and things went well for a first meeting. The committee plan to meet again June 23 and 24, 2021 and keep moving forward.

COVID-19 – Cumberland County is at a moderate level for COVID-19 according to the Cumberland County Board of Health. Although the county continues to have new cases every week and continues to have fatalities

more then we like. The Authority is following Governor Murphy's orders to wear masks indoors. We will continue to follow recommended precautions by the Center for Disease Control.

Sludge Disposal – The Authority is currently hauling two loads a day to DECORA with C&H and Franc Environmental providing assistance when needed. The sludge storage tank level is decreasing at this time.

Plant discharge. The plant experienced some efficiency problems this month. As the warmer temperatures stabilize, we expect this issue to resolve itself.

The Director noted the following as to Operations and Maintenance:

Operations has taken the north secondary clarifier out of service at this time. The clarifier is no longer needed with the current warmer temperatures.

Operations has taken the south contact zone out of service at this time. The longer detention time is not longer needed, and the disinfection process is operating well.

Maintenance has installed the new flow meters at the sludge storage tank and are currently in service without any problems being reported.

The Authority has hired a new operator and has begun the training process. He is currently working with maintenance staff and will be placed in rotation when this is completed.

Hall & Associates has begun the data collection portion of the new headworks analysis with no problems being reported.

Collection System – Pennoni Engineering has continued working on the planned Glass Street Pump Station upgrade.

Miscellaneous

The Authority is requesting approval to go out to bid for the laboratory fume hood installation.

Committee Reports: I understand we have one report tonight from the Finance and Budget Committee. Todd Edwards & Bernhard Capital Presentation.

The Director then made a statement "For the record - I want everyone to know that the meetings held between CCUA Finance Committee and Bernhard Capital was without my knowledge and/or consent. The meetings were not held at the CCUA but off site at another location. This is extremely disappointing to have been kept in the dark and not given the opportunity to express my opinions when discussing the future of the Authority, our workers, retirees, and rate payers.

With that said, I look forward to Bernhard presentation and will keep an open mind for the good of all."

Director Errickson reported there are five (5) resolutions on the agenda for tonight; Resolution #3165 – Change order for Marmero Law group; Resolution #3166 – Awarding contract to Pennoni Engineering for services with Glass Street Pump Station upgrades; Resolution #3167 – Authorizing advertisement for bid for Fume Hood replacement; Resolution #3168 – Awarding contract to Pennoni Engineering for services with Fume Hood replacement; and Resolution #3169 – awarding contract to Pennoni Engineering for Construction Management and Inspection services for the Headworks project.

Mr. Errickson stated there is no Closed session planned tonight.

In conclusion, the Director offered his thanks to the staff, engineer, and Legal Counsel for their help with preparing his report.

Engineer

Headworks Grit and Screen Replacement:

Schedule

The Hydro-Dyne Engineering Inc's grit and screening equipment was placed on order by the Authority in March 2021. The equipment lead time is 20 weeks.

MBE Mark III Electric Inc. of Madison, NJ was awarded the project April 15th in the contract amount of \$1,771,000 to install equipment.

Contracts Documents were forwarded to the Authority May 7th for review and signature.

Pennoni received, and currently reviewing, Contractor's equipment submittals.

Anticipated start of construction September 2021 with pre-construction meetings before and after delivery of equipment.

Replacement of Laboratory Fume Hood: Pennoni to begin the design and construction services in replacing the existing lab hood

Regarding Glass Street Pump Station and Force Main Upgrade: Pennoni to begin the design upgrade the pump station. Permitting/I-Bank funding are anticipated to be submitted this year; The construction anticipated in 2022. The estimated project cost is \$3.3 million dollars.

EQ Tank Structure: Pennoni to preparing technical specifications for structure repair and rehabilitation.

Primary Digester: Pennoni to perform requested structural and wielding inspections.

Plant Structure Coating: Pennoni in discussion with Authority for the repair and recoating of various plant structures.

Other project issues:

Request to receive backwash water from Upper Deerfield Township (UDT). Pennoni assisting the Authority, as needed.

Upper Deerfield Sewer Pipe Rehab: Pennoni to assist the Authority once the project begins, as needed.

Solar System: Pennoni assisted Authority, as needed,, with the mandatory Annual Electric Generator Report.

Maps/Plans

On request by the Authority, Pennoni performs site surveys at the Plant. The last Plant survey was performed at the Primary and Secondary clarifiers.

Upper Deerfield Sewer Pipe Rehab: We anticipate work 2021/2022

Solar System: Pennoni assisting Authority, as needed, with the mandatory Annual Electrical Generator Report.

Pennoni to perform on site plant surveys on request of the Authority the primary and secondary clarifiers were the latest to be performed.

Auditor

Mr. Tessa reported they provided staff assistance as requested. We are continuing to work on 2020 Audit(remotely) The GASB 68 Pension Reports from the State of New Jersey, and the GASB 75 Other-Employment Benefits report from the State of New Jersey(health benefits)have yet to be completed. These will

be needed for us to be able to complete the Audit. We will keep the Authority informed as to progress of the Audit and the financial statement.

General Council

Upper Deerfield still going on. Labor and Union negotiations continue

Barnhart presentation.

Labor and employment day to day issues.

Chairperson Jones stated, "Like the Director said I was not involved in the Bernhard presentation, but I look forward to it, but it is unusual that it does not come before the chairman. No discussion, or conversation and to be honest I'm not very happy with it. If we are going to work together then we have to be together. That is the way I like to run things. Nobody should have anything to hide.

Commissioner Zarko stated, "I feel like the committee just met with Bernhard in the dark. I feel like the public is being high jacked by the Authority. I don't feel the Budget Committee gave proper respect to the Chairperson or Director in regard to when they were going to meet on the issue. I'm not looking forward to hearing the from Bernhard, but I will respect them.

Commissioner Edwards stated," I'm the person that set up the meeting. I did not know I had to tell you about the meeting. Today, is simply a presentation from the company so everyone can see and hear what they have to say. After the Budget Committee saw the presentation I contacted Chairperson Jones. I asked Al to put Bernhard on the agenda for a presentation.

Chairperson Jones, stated, "The Authority has a policy that it follows."

Commissioner Edwards stated "I'm the committee chair and I held the meeting at a place that I had other meetings at that day. Commissioner Dawson and Attorney Zeff were present."

Chairman Jones, asked "Was there a secretary present?"

Commissioner Edwards said" I had attorney Zeff there"

Legal Counsel Zeff stated, we are listening, Part of my job is to make sure we vet this issue. We understand what they can offer us, but we must make sure everything is right before we enter into an agreement. They are here to present, and we can discuss and raise issues.

John Doe#1 in regard to Bernhard presenter "How do you get paid?"

Bernhard rep" We make a return on our investment. Typical banking structure."

Banging of gavel made it difficult to hear exchange between Chairperson Jones and Commissioner Edwards.

Commissioner Dawson, Director pays bills, and takes all the responsibility to make money grow and deal with day-to-day operations of the Authority. I joined the financial committee meeting and I understand this as an opportunity for the Authority to grow. The Authority is running well so its attractive from and investment standpoint. This plant will continue to run and pay its bills and nothing changes. If we can unlock money to run other projects that makes sense, and we should look into that.

As Bernhard Presentation continued there were several comments made and the audio was very difficult to understand.

Many statements and questions from the public and professionals including, General Council Zeff, Commissioner Dawson, Mayer Albert Kelly and County Commissioner Barber were verbalized during the by Bernhard Capital presentation. A long discussion ensued between all parties.

Deputy County Commissioner Barber stated that she was very disappointed in the Board for not following Roberts Rules. She encouraged the Authority to reach out to all Mayors and commissioners to talk about plans, purpose and goals for the money.

Commissioner T. Edwards made a motion for RFQ to monetize the Authority which was seconded by Commissioner Smith-Bey and carried unanimously.
